## OU Nurse Anesthesia Program director honored

Karen L. Zaglaniczny, director of the Oakland University/William Beaumont Graduate Nurse Anesthesia Program, was chosen from more than two million registered nurses to be a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing.

The academy is comprised of 1,000 distinguished nursing leaders who have contributed to their profession through publications, research, awards and honors, professional activities and community service. Zaglaniczny will be inducted at the Academy's November 2000 Annual Meeting and Conference in San Diego, Calif.

"It is a great honor to receive this prestigious award and become a Fellow in the Academy of Nursing," Zaglaniczny said.

She also is the Director of Perioperative Services Education and Research at William Beaumont Hospital. She has been involved in the American Association of Nurse Anesthetists (AANA) and is currently chairman of the AANA Foundation for Education and Research.

Zaglaniczny is renowned for her work in anesthesia education and has lectured at local, national and international meetings. She has written chapters for several textbooks and has authored her own book, *Clinical Guide for Pediatric Anesthesia*.
