First Aid Book Series

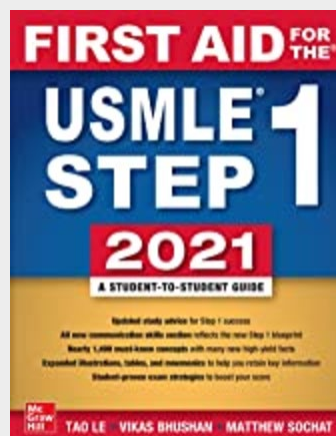
Did you know that the Medical Library provides online access to the complete collection of the popular [First Aid](#) series of review books?

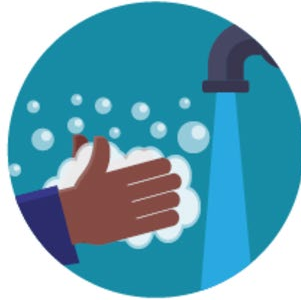
Medical Library Hours & Continued Hybrid Services

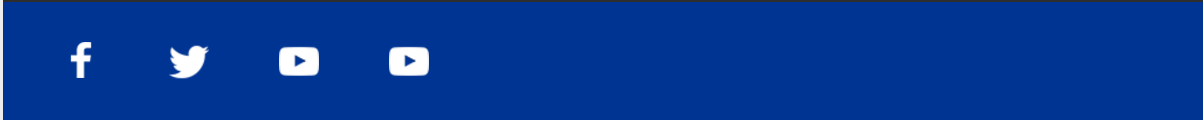
