Terrorist discussions held throughout month

Oakland University is hosting a series of panel discussions entitled "Attack on America: The Aftermath" throughout October.

The discussions will inform the Oakland University community of events surrounding the recent terrorist attacks on the United States and to provide an arena for discussion. Each of the three discussions is sponsored by the **Center for Student Activities** and is open to the public.

"The purpose is to make sure that students, faculty and staff have the ability to give opinions, ask questions and stay informed," said Paul Franklin, coordinator of campus programs and organizer of the forums.

The first discussion of the month is set for Tuesday, Oct. 2, from noon to 1 p.m. in the Oakland Center's Heritage Room. The discussion is titled "Why is the U.S.A. the Most Loved and Most Hated Country in the World?"

The second discussion being planned is "Religion and Terrorism: Are They Compatible?" which is scheduled for Thursday, Oct. 18, from noon to 1 p.m. in the Oakland Center's Fireside Lounge. This event will feature community religious leaders as panelists.

The final discussion of the month, "The Economic Impact - Locally and Globally," is set for Tuesday, Oct. 30, from noon to 1 p.m. in the Oakland Center's Fireside Lounge.
