## **OU's Alumni Association award scholarships**

The Oakland University Alumni Association (OUAA) recently awarded \$26,000 in scholarships to 15 OU students.

The OUAA scholarship program awarded 13 different affiliate scholarships to juniors and seniors and two legacy scholarships. The legacy scholarships are awarded to incoming freshmen and current OU sophomores who have a parent or grandparent who graduated from Oakland University.

This year's winners are:

Martin Moen of Junction City, Ore., a senior majoring in accounting, received the School of Business Administration Alumni Affiliate Scholarship. Moen is a co-captain of the OU Men's and Women's Varsity Swim Team, an orientation group leader, a Connections peer leader, a water safety and swimming instructor, and is a member of the Student Athlete Advisory Council.

Michael McGuinness of South Lyon, a junior majoring in political science, received the College of Arts and Sciences Alumni Affiliate Scholarship. He is also the recipient of the Mr. AmeriCorps Award. McGuinness is a chair on the Student Activities Funding Board, an AmeriCorps National Service member, "The Oakland Post" circulation manager, and part of the Oakland University Leadership Institute.
