Programs focus on plant closings

Plant closings and the often brutal effects on people and communities is the topic of two special summer programs offered by the Center for Community and Human Development.

"The Impact of Plant Closings" (CHD 200) will be presented for credit July 7 through July 17 and will feature OU professors, a UAW representative, and other guest lecturers.

The topics cover economic issues, the labor perspective, research resources, and the Pontiac/Hamtramck situation.

On July 12 legislators, union officials, community leaders, and special interest groups will gather at OU for a one day conference on "Strategies for Coping with

Plant Closings." Speakers include Congressman William Ford, a noted expert on industrial relations, and Robert Battle III and Ken Morris of the UAW. They are directors of UAW regions IA and IB, respectively.

The sessions will begin at 8:30 a.m. in Varner Recital Hall. The fee of \$5 includes lunch. Interested persons call 377-3216.

DSO features OU artists

Two OU artists will figure prominently in the July 5 concert by the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

The Meadow Brook Music Festival performance will offer the world premiere of Stanley Hollingsworth's Concerto for Piano and Orchestra. The work was written for Flavio Varani who will be DSO guest soloist for the concert.

Varani has performed with major symphony orchestras and in recital in this country and abroad. A native of Brazil, he won a French government scholarship at the age of 13. He studied piano for six years at the Paris National Conservatory with Magda Tagliaferro, the near legendary pianist who performed at OU last year to rave reviews. In 1960 Varani won the highest award at the International Chopin Competition in Majorca, Spain. He came to America in 1965 and graduated from the Manhattan School of Music. Other compositions include the "The master's degrees. He has been OU artist in residence since 1972.

Hollingsworth has achieved an international reputation for his works although this is his first concerto. Three operas, "The Mother," "The Selfish Giant," and "Harrison Left His Umbrella" will be performed next summer at the acclaimed Spoleto Festival in Charleston, S.C.

The composer's awards include the Prix de Rome, a Guggenheim Fellowship, and a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts. A former pupil and then assistant to Gian Carlo Menotti, Hollingsworth's other compositions include the "The Dumbarton Oaks Mass," "Sabar Mater," and a one act opera entitled "La Grande Breteche" commissioned by NBC Television. He has been resident composer at

five famous locations, Wolf Trap, Yaddo, the MacDowell Colony, Montalvo Center, and the Ossabow Island Project.

Aussicker leaves

David Aussicker, assistant director, Center for General and Career Studies will leave in early August to accept the position of assistant dean for extended campus programs at The American University, Washington, DC. Aussicker came to Oakland in 1976 as coordinator of Cooperative Education Programs and has been with the Center for General and Career Studies since 1977.

New CU boss

Tom Coletta is the new branch manager of the Oakland Office of the Michigan State University Federal Credit Union. He joined the staff on June 9 and has been working in the OU office since June 16. He replaces Grace Kosaski who was killed in an automobile accident in early May.

Prior to this appointment he had been credit administration officer at the Dearborn Federal Credit Union.

Coletta announces that all loan restrictions have been lifted and the credit union is back to business as usual. However, new interest rates have been established—13 percent for new car loans and 15 percent for used car loans. All other loans are 15 percent. Dean Felton resigns

Geraldene Felton, professor and dean of the School of Nursing, will leave OU Feb. 28 to accept similar appointments at the College of Nursing, University of Iowa.

Dean Felton joined the OU faculty in December 1974 and established the undergraduate program and the new master's program that was approved recently by the University Senate.

Frederick W. Obear, academic vice-president and provost, said Dean Felton's departure will be a "great loss." Obear cited her "enormous" contributions in

building the nursing program and noted that she had timed her departure so that there would be adequate time to work with her colleagues to find a replacement.

Obear announced the dean's resignation at the June 18 meeting of the Board of Trustees, the same meeting in which her reappointment was up for action by the board. Dean Felton was reappointed by the board with the notation that she would be leaving the university on February 28, 1981.

Sunset Terrace caper

Two men are in Oakland County jail awaiting charges of breaking and entering following a June 20 incident at Oakland University.

The men were apprehended by OU public safety officers outside Sunset Terrace at approximately 2:30 p.m. The officers were alerted by an electronic alarm. Sunset Terrace has been vacant since former OU President Donald D. O'Dowd moved to New York.

Dick Leonard, director of public safety, said the university will seek warrants charging the men with breaking and entering. Evidence taken at the scene is being evaluated by the Oakland County Sheriff's Department and by the Madison Heights Crime Lab (a state facility).

As the *OU News* went to press the men were being detained on "holds" placed on them by other law enforcement agencies.
