- ride needed to east side of Detroit (Friday afternoons and to campus on Sunday night or Monday morning), call 2637.

- Q. I was curious as to the significance, if any, of the title Contact 11. Is it just a copy from the News?
- A. There's supposed to be 11 members of Commuter Council, elected at large each year. We wanted this newsletter to be a means of communication between the Council and the Commuter Students. Right now the Council is short one member: if you are interested in filling the position, come to the Council meeting (Monday at 2pm in the Faculty Lounge, O.C.) or inquire at the Commuter Council desk in the Activities Center.
- Q. Is it possible for a Commuter to eat in the Vandenburg cafeteria?
- A. Yes, just buy a meal ticket at the Vandenburg desk. Dinners are \$1.65 and lunches are \$1.25.
- Q. How can I appeal my unjust parking ticket?
- A. Within 5 days of receipt of the citation, submit a written appeal on the form available at the Cashiers in the O.C., and N.F.H. or the Gate House. Your appeal will be brought before The Parking Appeals Commission, a board composed of members of the faculty. If your appeal is denied you may then submit a request for a personal audience to plead your case.
