### FROM THE SCHOOL OF EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES

*From Executive Director of the Office of Public School Academies Judeen Bartos:*

I recently had the wonderful opportunity to join my University colleagues at the employee recognition event for those of us reaching our 10 and 20 years of service at OU. We all marveled at how much has changed both at the University and within our own worlds. When I began working at OU in 2005, my son was 20 months old and preschool was our biggest concern. Now at twelve, he is looking high school in the eye in another year and dropping thoughts about where he would like to go to college into casual conversations. (Go Grizzlies!)



The changes within the Office of Public School Academies have been equally transformative. 2005 marked our ten year anniversary as an authorizer. In the ten years since then, our office operations have grown and matured. Compliance monitoring remains a central tenet, now achieved with a web-based management system that has greatly improved the ease of collecting and tracking documentation. The institution of bi-annual computer adaptive testing provides the Academies with real-time data to influence instruction and enables us to assess student growth along with achievement levels.

During the decade since 2005, the office has increased its focus on outreach to Academy students and professional development opportunities for Academy staff and administrators. Students visit campus early and often with a goal of establishing a comfort level with the college experience that strives to turn the dream of a college degree into a tangible reality. When students graduate from our charter schools, they have the opportunity to apply for a competitive scholarship to assist in reaching this goal. Currently, five graduates are aided by this funding and attending OU.

It has indeed been a productive and enjoyable ten year journey here at OU! I look forward to an equally rewarding second decade not only for myself, but for the schools we charter as well.

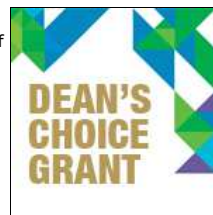
### Dean's Choice Grant - Video Contest

### Chaturi Edrisinha and Darlene Grooms Present at Autism Conference

Drs. Chaturi Edrisinha and Darlene Grooms from Human Development and Child Studies jointly presented at the Autism Alliance of Michigan's *Navigating Autism Today!* Conference on March 4, 2016. The presentation shared findings from a recent survey conducted by the Center for Autism among Oakland University students with autism spectrum disorders (ASD), as well as current federal policy aimed at employment.

Specifically, Dr. Grooms discussed how "The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act" serves to enhance collaboration among core federal partners (i.e., Departments of Labor, Education, and Commerce) to increase the effectiveness of employment outcomes for all citizens.

The presentation highlighted one core partner, the Vocational Rehabilitation Program, which seeks to improve the transition from postsecondary education and integrated, competitive employment among individuals with disabilities. Post presentation, Drs. Edrisinha and Grooms spoke with many parents who were interested in programs offered at Oakland University for persons with ASD.



### STEM Training for PSA Teachers

The PSA Office collaborated with the OU School of Engineering and Computer Science (SECS) Outreach Program to offer a *STEM Training for Teachers* workshop on February 12th. The workshop, facilitated by Dr. Chris Kobus, Marianne Donoghue and several graduate students from the SECS provided staff exciting new ways to integrate next generation science and mathematics standards into their class curriculum.

Teachers and school leaders from Caniff Liberty Academy, Four Corners Montessori Academy, Weston Preparatory Academy, Detroit Academy of Arts and Sciences and Star International Academy used hands-on modules to learn constructs of electricity, kinetic energy and binary code.



### Excellence in Mentoring Faculty Award - Call for Nominations

The Excellence in Mentoring Faculty Award will be awarded to two full-time faculty members annually who have demonstrated excellence in mentoring in one of these three areas: teaching, scholarship or service. Her work is focused on a number of topics related to obesity such as risk factors, associated diseases (e.g., CVD and diabetes), interventions (behavior change, technology), and related consequences (i.e., poor health-related quality of life).
