Oakland University is hosting the 10th Annual Ambassador Leonard Woodcock Legacy Seminar on China on Thursday, April 8, at 1:30 p.m. at **Meadow Brook Hall**.

The event will feature speakers representing the People's Republic of China and the United States and experts in global economics and politics, legal and trade issues and Sino-American relations.

Oakland's Ambassador Leonard Woodcock Legacy Program promotes understanding between the United States and China in areas such as trade relations, international law, politics and education. It also fosters exchange of faculty and students between the two nations.

The Woodcock project aids Michigan's economic development by providing academic and political leaders and potential trade partners with the latest information on China. The program also has played a significant role in working to establish trade between businesses in Oakland County and China.

The seminar is named in honor of Leonard Woodcock, former U.A.W. president who served as the first U.S. ambassador to the People's Republic of China between 1979 and 1981.
