Summer music festival schedule announced

The **Meadow Brook Music Festival** opens its season Friday, May 24, with one of the most accomplished young composers and performers of our time.

Harry Connick Jr., whose recordings include the double-platinum soundtrack to "When Harry Met Sally," will perform with his Big Band to begin the season at the outdoor amphitheater on the campus of Oakland University. The annual summer festival offers a variety of entertainment choices including pop, rock, country, jazz and folk music, comedy and stage productions. It is also the summer home of the **Detroit Symphony Orchestra**.

Among the other performers this year are pop star Jewell, classic rock bands Jethro Tull and the Monkees, and comedians Carrot Top and the Amazing Jonathan. Family events such as the Magic School Bus and the Detroit Symphony Orchestra's Family Fun Fridays also are scheduled. Other events such as the Bluegrass Festival and Michigan Wine and Food Festival provide entertainment for all tastes.
