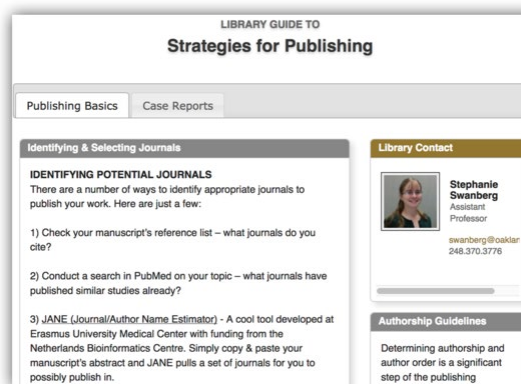

Resource of the Month: PsychiatryOnline

WHAT IS IT? [PsychiatryOnline](#) is a collection of electronic books, journals, guidelines, drug information, and patient information resources from the American Psychiatric Association. One of the key features is full-text access to DSM titles including *DSM-5*, *DSM-5 Handbook of Differential Diagnosis*, and *DSM-5 Clinical Cases*. Other key resources include the *American Psychiatric Press Textbook of Psychiatry* and the *American Journal of Psychiatry*.

HOW DO I ACCESS IT? The link to PsychiatryOnline can be found on the library's [Databases](#) web page. Individual books and journals with links are included in the library catalog.

FEATURES INCLUDE:

- **Simple Search:** The ability to search across different types of material (journals, books, guidelines) from a single search box.
- **Textbooks:** Leading textbooks that are continuously updated as new editions are published. See the full list [here](#).
- **Current Content:** Journal articles are available online ahead of print, and new APA Practice Guidelines and revisions to DSM codes are posted as issued.
- **Linked Material:** Diagnoses in DSM are linked to related topics in relevant textbooks – for example, to Gabbard's *Treatments of Psychiatric Disorders* for treatment information and to related journal articles.
- **Review Material and CME:** Study guides with review questions are available for the major texts, and free [AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™](#) is available for reading journal articles and taking brief exams.

IS THERE AN APP FOR THAT? No, but the site is optimized to display well on mobile devices.

PsychiatryOnline contains advertisements for other American Psychiatric Publishing titles and third-party products that can be distracting. If you see an APA book on the site that is not covered by our license, but you feel would be a good addition to our collection, please let us know.

Please note that PsychiatryOnline is just one of several resources available from the OUWB Medical Library that cover psychiatry, psychology, and behavioral health.
