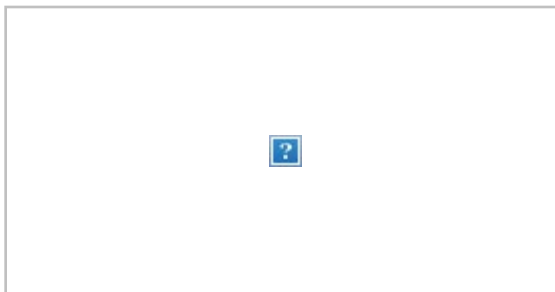
## PubMed Search Tip of the Month: A Recap

This past year, we ran a series of articles on PubMed – the National Library of Medicine’s free interface to Medline. The OUWB Medical Library focuses its information mastery curriculum around PubMed because, as a free resource, it will be available to our students wherever they do their residency training or wind up practicing medicine!

Medline is widely considered the world’s premier medical bibliographic database: it is updated on an almost daily basis, contains more than 23 million citations, covers 5,600 worldwide journals in about 40 languages, and covers 1946 to the present. PubMed provides an extremely powerful interface to Medline, taking full advantage of rich indexing (MeSH – Medical Subject Headings).

- **[August – PubMed Search Box](#) *If you remember nothing else, remember this:* Start your search at the PubMed search box found at the top of every page of the library’s web site or use the PubMed link on the Medical Library’s “Databases” web page. This link contains a special string of coding that causes the Kresge Library Get It! button to display. This is your link to our full-text subscriptions. You can also save the link (<https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed?otool=mioakulib>) as a “Favorite” for easy access.**
