Oakland University to host Kensall Wise

Oakland University will host Kensall Wise of the University of Michigan in a lecture, "Wireless Integrated MicroSystems (WIMS): Coming Revolution in the Gathering of Information," scheduled for Monday, April 5, at 4 p.m. in the Oakland Center Banquet Room A.

Wise received his Ph.D. in electrical engineering from Stanford University in 1969. He currently is a professor of electrical engineering and computer science at the University of Michigan and is a J. Reid and Polly Anderson Professor of Manufacturing Technology. He also serves as the director for the Center for Wireless Integrated MicroSystems, an NSF engineering research center.
