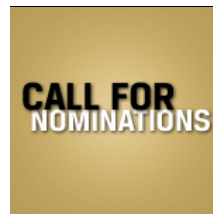


Excellence in Mentoring Faculty Award - Call for Nominations

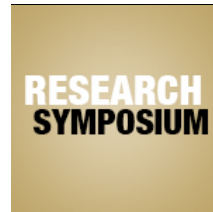
