## OU to offer workshop for special-needs students

Oakland University's **School of Education and Human Services** (SEHS) is offering a workshop, "The Transition Process, Planning Services and Options for Special-Needs Students," from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday, July 30, through Thursday, August 2, at the Macomb Intermediate School District in Clinton Township.

The workshop will focus on the outcomes of special-needs students who are finishing school. It will address defining transition from school to adult life, state and federal legislation and models of transition planning.

Harriet S. Linkowski, special education consultant and trainer for the Transition Services Project, will lead the course. Linkowski has extensive experience in providing in-service training and workshops to educators, parents and students. She has presented at numerous state and national conferences. She also has served as a consultant, learning-disabled diagnostician and work-study coordinator.

The cost of the workshop is \$295, if enrolled for continuing education units (CEUs). There is an option to take the course for two university graduate credits.
