Adult Career Counseling Center offering free guidance

Oakland University's Adult Career Counseling Center (ACCC) is offering free computer-assisted guidance and individual counseling to adults considering a career change or re-entering the job market.

"These computer programs are used in combination with individual counseling to aid clients in self-analysis of their interests, values and experiences," said ACCC Director Dr. Jane Goodman and professor for the Department of Counseling. "At the ACCC, advisors will help clients identify education and training programs, develop their resume, and enhance interviewing skills."

Services include one-on-one counseling, computer and written career assessments, decision making, educational planning, help with resumes and cover letters, as well as interviewing skills enhancement. Descriptions of careers, including salary ranges, training and educational requirements, also are available.

The ACCC is located in 123 O'Dowd on the university's campus. Office hours are 9 a.m.-9 p.m. Monday-Thursday and 9 a.m.-3 p.m. Friday-Saturday. For more information, call (248) 370-3092.
