The grant is awarded by the Arnold P. Gold Foundation Research Institute, which was institute was established in 2012 to discover and disseminate knowledge about humanizing medicine to improve health and the human condition. The winners of the grant will join a prestigious community of scholars and present their findings at a symposium designed to illuminate best practices and set an agenda for future research on the practice of teaching humanistic healthcare.
