Provides a concise overview of cardiovascular anatomy, pathophysiology, diagnosis, and management in addition to images in the Netter tradition. Downloadable pdfs of each chapter are also available.



Rapid Interpretation of EKG's, 6th Edition

Dale Dubin's essential clinical text covers the basic principles of interpreting EKGs, including recording, heart rhythm and rate as well as monitoring for conditions such as hypertrophy and infarction and in premature infants.

First Aid Review Series now available Electronically!

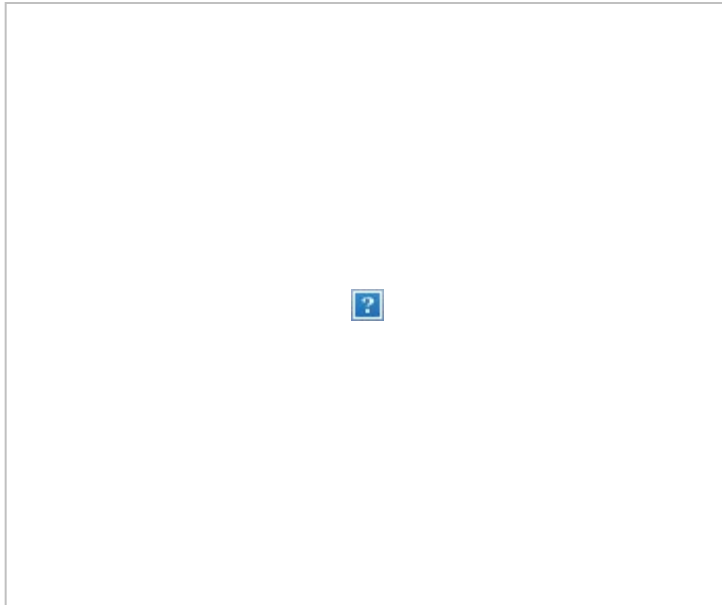
The library now has electronic access to the entire **First Aid Review Book Series** from McGraw-Hill. The series includes favorites such as:

New Resource Trials

The Medical Library now has trial access to the following electronic resources:

- **Scopus** - Scopus is a multi-disciplinary database with access to over 20,000 titles from over 5,000 publishers, including peer-reviewed journals in the health, physical, life, and social sciences. Scopus also features a variety of author and journal analytic tools. Trial access is available through February 28 so check it out today!
- **Browzine** - Browzine is a mobile application that allows you to quickly and easily peruse open access and library journal subscriptions in one interface. As a compliment to searching, you can browse, read, and monitor the latest scholarly literature. Trial access is available for free through the App Store for iPads only. Android is coming soon!
