## MARCHERS ACT--SENATORS DON'T--ON VIETNAM DEMONSTRATION

An "official enlistment" of more than 200 and Lord only knows how many free-loaders left as envoys from Oakland University to participate in the March Against Death in Washington, D.C., last weekend. Student Activities Center helped the New Mobilization Committee enroll 180 students and two faculty members who rode four chartered buses to the nation's capital to demonstrate against the Vietnam War. Thirteen persons also signed up to drive marchers to Washington in their personal cars. Housing for most of the OU participants was arranged in churches and private homes, but many went trusting blind luck to find accommodations.

In a related matter, the University Senate met for almost three hours on Tuesday to consider three resolutions for a stand on the demonstration and found agreement as hard to come by as a brush-cut at an SDS meeting. Three alternate resolutions submitted by the external affairs committee of the Senate called for (1) a cessation of all classes on November 14, (2) a recommendation that all faculty members either cancel classes after consultation with class members or excuse individual students at their request, or (3) a non-advocacy "of a stand on any political issue, other than on one which concerns the rights of its faculty and students to freedom of inquiry on any subject." The Senate subsequently received a fourth alternate resolution, endorsed by the OU hourly employees, calling for support of the Nixon administration in its efforts to seek an end to the war. After much argument and several amendments to the various resolutions, the meeting dissolved at 6:25 p.m. for want of a quorum.

## SHOW TO AID LIBRARY
