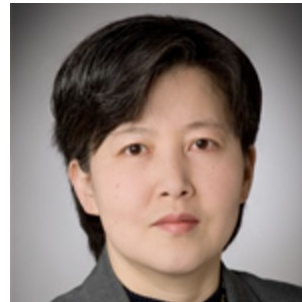


## **ACCOLADES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

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### **Ji-Eun Lee Publishes Research**

Two articles co-authored by Ji-Eun Lee, professor in TDES, have recently appeared in journals published by *The Korean Society of Educational Studies in Mathematics* and *The Korean Society of Mathematical Education*. One paper, titled “Conceptualizing discursive teaching capacity: A case study of a middle school mathematics teacher,” is published in *School Mathematics*. Another one, titled “An analysis of U.S. pre-service teachers’ modeling and explaining of  $0.14 \text{ m}^2$ ,” is published in *The Mathematical Education*.

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### Jon Margerum-Leys and Mary Lose Attend Reading Recovery Council of Michigan Institute

Over 350 school district administrators and Reading Recovery, Literacy Lessons and Literacy Support educators from across the state came together from the 28th annual Reading Recovery Council of Michigan (RRCM) Institute, held November 21–22, 2019 at the Somerset Inn in Troy. This year's Institute theme was *Reading Recovery® and Literacy Lessons™: Teaching in Support of Young Learners*.

Oakland University's SEHS Dean, Dr. Jon Margerum-Leys, cordially welcomed the Institute participants on Thursday morning, which also included presentations of the 2019 RRCM Leadership Award in recognition of support for Reading Recovery to Dotty Hottum (Principal — Round Elementary, Hartland Consolidated Schools) and Mary Hillberry (Principal — Lone Pine Elementary, Bloomfield Hills Schools).

This year's Institute featured nationally renowned authors and keynote speakers from 10 universities around the United States and Canada, including Dr. Andrew Hargreaves, research professor at Boston College and visiting professor at the University of Ottawa, Hong Kong University and University of Stavanger; and Dr. Connie Briggs, professor and chair of the Department of Reading Education at Texas Woman's University.

The presenters, including Dr. Mary Lose, professor and director of OU's Reading Recovery Center, delivered 28 breakout sessions to inform and inspire the institute participants' continuing efforts on behalf of young children's literate futures.
