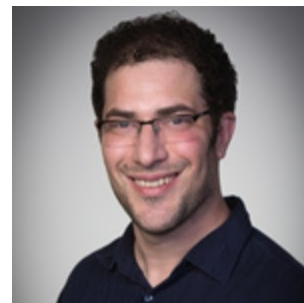
ACCOLADES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Oakland University 2018 A.P. Award Honoree

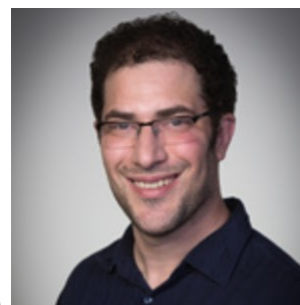
