### **NVivo Data Analysis Software**

**NVivo** is a data analysis tool that can import and analyze qualitative and mixed methods data from a variety of sources including text, audio, video, emails, images, spreadsheets, online surveys, and web content. The Medical Library has purchased two NVivo licenses, which are now available for use on the iMac desktop computers in the Medical Library Collaborative Study Room.

## Resource of the Month: UpToDate & DynaMed Plus

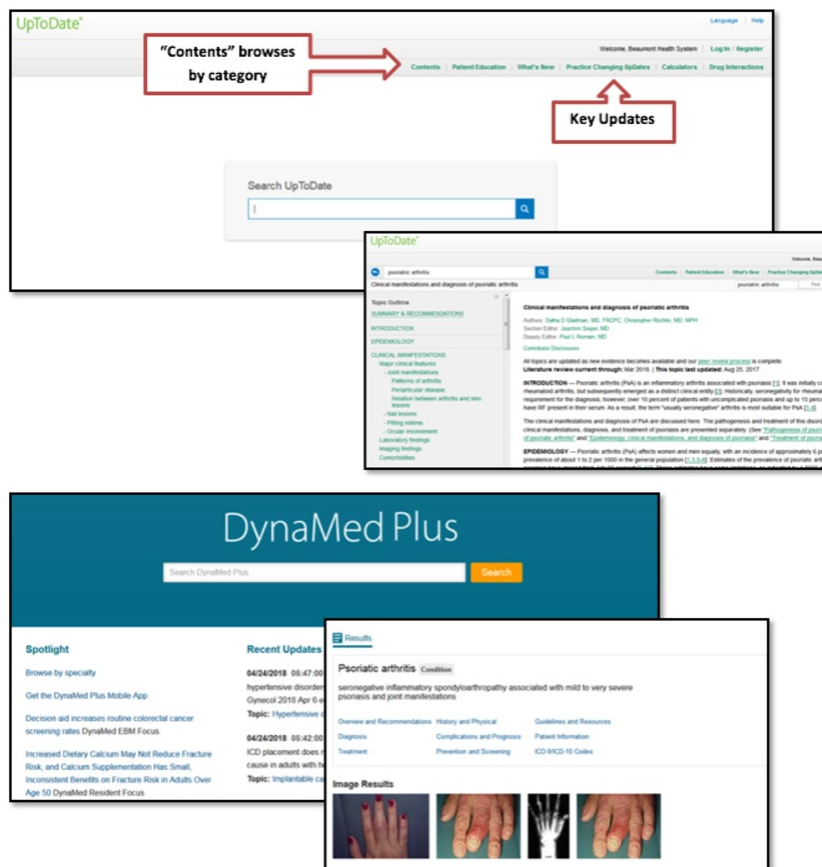
As our M2s get ready for their upcoming clerkships, it is the perfect time to take a closer look at two of our clinical, point-of-care resources.

### What are they?

Both [UpToDate](#) and [DynaMed Plus](#) are evidence-based, point-of-care information resources designed to find quick answers for patient care questions. UpToDate is larger and contains more topic summaries, but many feel DynaMed has a stronger evidence base, especially for primary care. We encourage you to try both to see which works best for your practice and patients.

### How do I access them?

The links to both databases can be found on the library's [Databases web page](#). They are also included on the library's online guide on [Evidence-Based Medicine Resources](#).



## Common Features Between UpToDate & DynaMed:

- Simple Google-like search boxes eliminate the need to use complicated search strategies – keep it simple!
- Ability to browse by topic/specialty
- Frequent updates keep you abreast of important studies
- Both offer free AMA PRA Category 1 Credits for point of care searches if you register for free accounts and login when you use the systems
- Patient information handouts

## Differences Between UpToDate & DynaMed:

### UpToDate

- Topics are text-heavy, resembling textbook chapters
- Navigation is made easy by a “Topic Outline” that allows quick access to a particular part of the topic
- Covers a broad range of topics, including General Surgery
- Began grading recommendations for treatment and screening in 2006; many, but not all topics have been graded for the level of evidence

### DynaMed Plus

- Topics are written as concise summaries in bulleted format
- “Overview and recommendations” are listed at the top of the Topic Outline for quick access
- Grading recommendations have been included on all topics since DynaMed launched in 1995

## Is there an app for that?

Yes, both the UpToDate and DynaMed Plus apps are free to OUWB faculty and students. Download the apps from iTunes or the App Store, and follow the directions listed on the library's [Mobile](#)
