Classes resume Wednesday, Sept. 12

The university will hold a memorial at noon, Wednesday, Sept. 12, for students, faculty and staff to reflect on the tragedy of Tuesday's terrorist attack.

Classes resume Wednesday morning for campus and extension courses. All campus offices and facilities also will be open.

"The entire OU community is deeply saddened and profoundly disturbed by the senseless acts of terrorism that occurred in Washington, D.C., and New York," said Gary Russi, president of Oakland University.

The memorial will be held at noon in the Gold Rooms of the Oakland Center for those who wish to gather to reflect, mourn and talk about this tragedy with others among the Oakland community.

Russi encourages members of the campus community who are interested to "please join us as we remember the victims of Tuesday's events in our prayers and thoughts."

Oakland University closed classes and campus at noon on Tuesday, Sept. 11, shortly after the terrorist attack as a precautionary measure to ensure the safety of students, faculty and staff.

"We also felt it was important for students, faculty and staff to reflect on the gravity of Tuesday's events and to spend time with their families," said Russi.

Students may seek assistance from the counselors at the **University Counseling Center** to discuss the national crisis.

Residence hall directors and residence assistants can contact a University Counseling Center counselor at any time Tuesday evening. Counselors also will be available from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday, and into the evening if needed.
