German-American author to read at OU

Oakland University will host German-American author Geertje Suhr in a reading of her short stories and poems. The event, hosted by the **Department of Modern Languages and Literatures**, is scheduled for Monday, March 15, at 4 p.m. in the Oakland Center.

Suhr, acclaimed novelist, poet and short-story writer, was born in Prague and moved to America when she married. Suhr studied German, French and psychology at the German universities of Tübingen, Freiburg and also in Lausanne, Switzerland. She continued her studies of German at the University of Illinois, Chicago and Urbana to receive her Ph.D. in German literature.

Suhr's poems and short stories are vignettes from everyday life and focus on the relationship between the sexes, cultural nuances, patterns of behavior and human follies.
