	<p>LGBT Health - This guide provides resources related to Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender health, from finding scholarly literature to health information for health professionals and patients. The guide is organized by topic area including general health information, health disparities, resources by age group, as well as stigma and violence.</p>
	<p>Resources for Conducting a Systematic Review - This guide highlights the best library and online resources available to help you successfully conduct a systematic review and/or meta-analysis. Includes links to research databases, eBooks, books, and resources to locate already published systematic reviews.</p>
	<p>Women in Medicine Collection - This guide is a comprehensive list of all the books and eBooks in the Medical Library's Women in Medicine Collection. The guide is organized by topic area including work-life balance, breaking stereotypes, personal stories and experiences, and looking back at the historical influence of women in medicine.</p>

- **Library Hours** Kresge Library is open 24/7 (excluding official University closings and holidays) including the Medical Library Collaborative and Quiet Study Rooms!

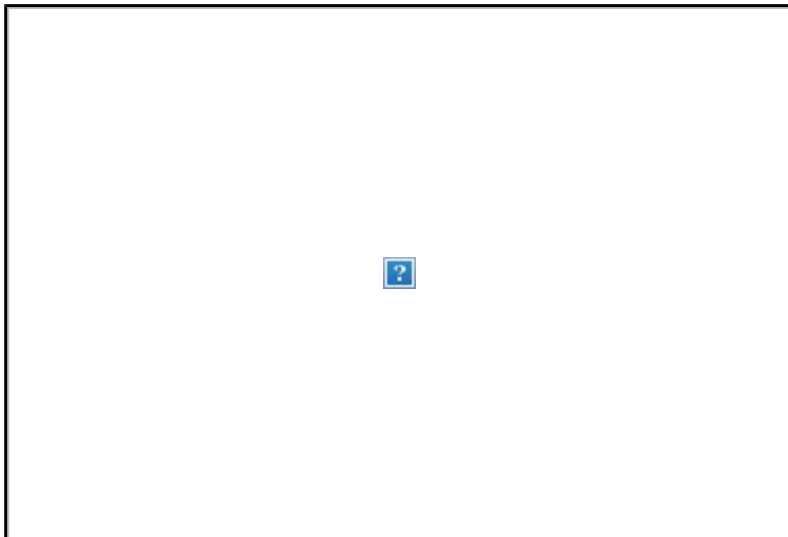
