OU to expand education specialist degree offerings

Oakland University's **School of Education and Human Services** (SEHS) is expanding its educational leadership degree program. Applications are being accepted for the education specialist degree (Ed.S.) cohort program at locations at the Warren Consolidated Schools Administration building in Warren and Lakeland High School in White Lake.

The two-year program is designed to prepare educators for administrative leadership positions in public and private schools. Up to 28 credits of the Ed.S. degree may be applied toward Oakland University's Ph.D. in educational leadership.
