## Lynetta Mosby

Shortly after arriving at OU in 1997, Lynetta Mosby, assistant professor of sociology and anthropology, became director of the social work concentration. At that time, there were only two students in the concentration, but through her leadership and program development skills, more than 70 students have been enrolled (through fall 2001). Half of these students have graduated and half of the graduates have gone on to earn MSW degrees. The others are employed full time in social service occupations.

Since 1997, Mosby has created three new courses that constitute the core of the concentration, established the Social Work Club for students and the annual Scherer Lecture Series.

Over the past three years, she has supervised 40 interns in 17 different agencies, including Parents and Children Together (Detroit), Crossroads for Youth (Oxford), Harbor Oaks Hospital (New Baltimore), St. Vincent and Sarah Fisher Center (Farmington Hills), Common Ground Sanctuary (Bloomfield) and Crittenton Hospital (Rochester).
