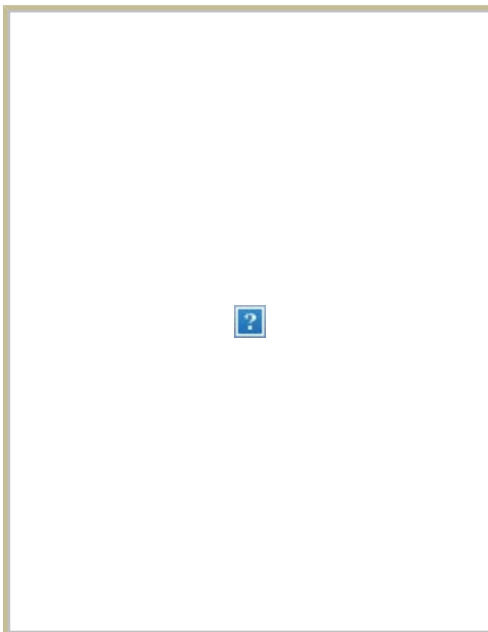
4th Annual Organ & Bone Marrow Registration Drive

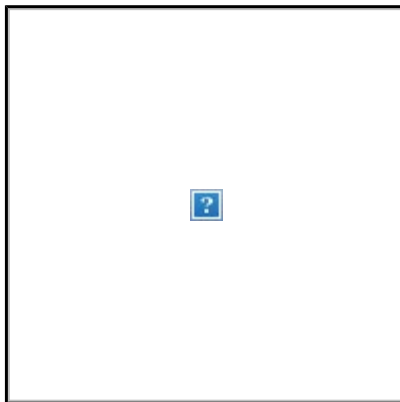
