Student to present research at conference

Oakland University graduate student Narine Mirijanian will present her research on breast cancer as an invited presenter at the Second Young Medics' International Conference, "From Prevention to Intervention," Sept. 26-28 in Yerevan, Armenia.

Her presentation, "Hormonal Regulation of Oncoproteins in Breast Cancer Cells," details findings of her research.

"I am very pleased that Narine has been invited to share her work among her peers from around the globe," said Virinder K. Moudgil, vice president for Academic Affairs and provost and faculty research mentor to Mirijanian. "Narine is a dedicated student whose hard work is evident through the research she conducts."
