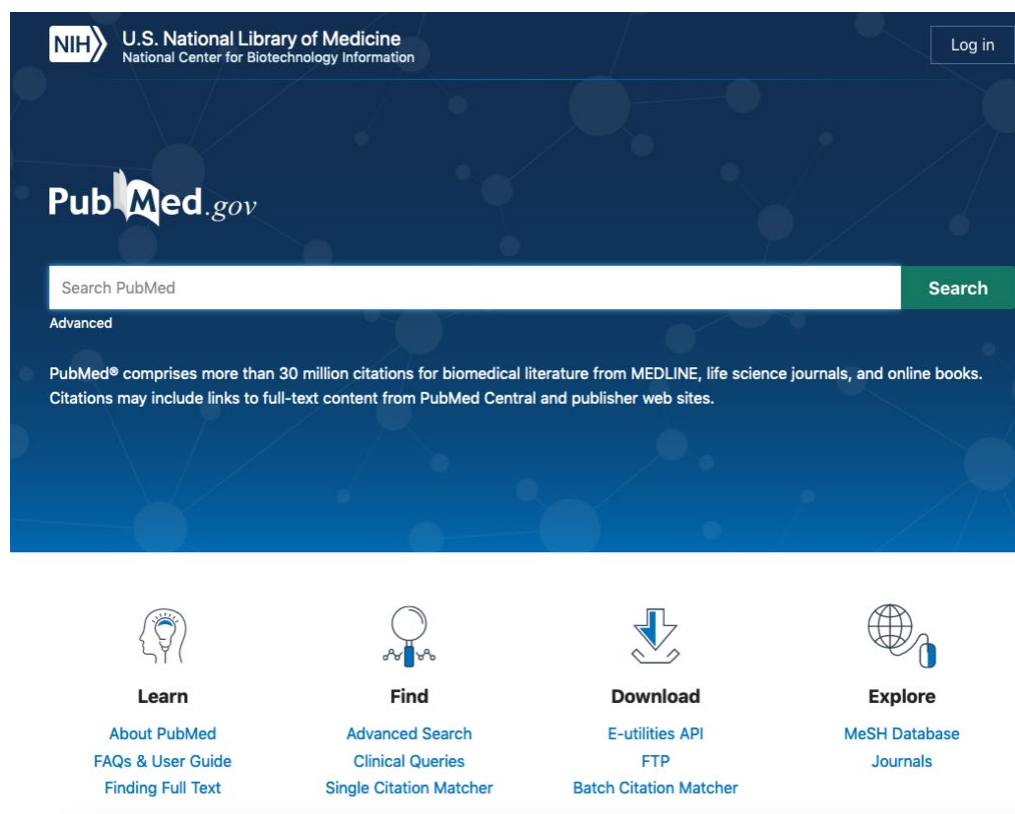

Introducing the New PubMed!

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If you've accessed PubMed recently, you may have been automatically redirected to the [new PubMed interface](#) or noticed an announcement on the [legacy PubMed homepage!](#) Currently in soft launch, the new PubMed will become the default search interface in early 2020. Improvements are continually being made to the site, but here are some changes and new features on the new PubMed:

- New design of the homepage, search results page, search filters, and individual citation pages
- Responsive design to facilitate better mobile access
- "Cite" allows you to copy/paste citations of individual articles in AMA, MLA, APA, and NLM citation styles
- "Share" allows you to share individual citations to Facebook or Twitter or send a citation to someone by copying/pasting a permalink
- "Cited by" on individual citation pages provides a list of articles in PubMed Central citing that work
- The "Send To" dropdown menu where you can save citations to Clipboard and Collections has been moved next to the Save and Email buttons
- "Search Details" showing how PubMed interpreted your search has been moved to the Advanced Search page instead of showing on the right side of the results page

- **Thursday, January 2:** reopens at 7:30am and 24/7 resumes

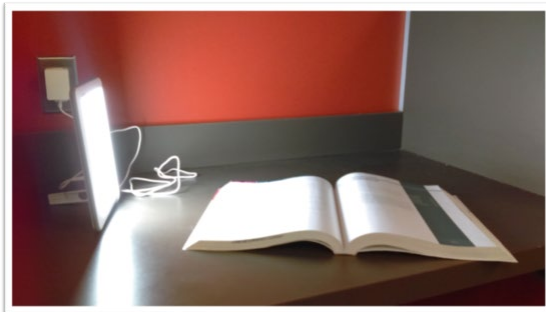
