The SBRC is in overall agreement with the proposal for a PhD in Computer Science. However, a few minor problems have been noticed.

Perhaps most importantly, the student survey on pages 47-48 only lists the responses for 2 of the 8 multiple choice questions. Most importantly, responses to questions #5 and #6 need to be listed. The listed answers to #1 and #8 might be listed separately for those who answer "yes" or "maybe" to #2 (as opinions on the program from those students not interested in a PhD might not be extremely relevant).

The letters at the very end of the proposal were very encouraging and indicate the program likely will be very successful in educating students for careers in the field, implying at least eventual success in recruiting students. The additional synergy with MIS is also a plus. However, the promotion of the program seems kind of light (at least with respect to recruiting students from outside Oakland University), as does the budget for promotion (=\$0?). If initially, the program doesn't attract many additional students, assumedly the hiring of the extra faculty member could be postponed.

In addition, it is unclear whether the estimated external funding is gross or net of expenses. Only the contribution to OU's overhead should be included in the incremental budget. While the program is estimated to generate positive incremental cash flows even without this incremental revenue, the item needs to be clarified or corrected.
