Noted children's book author to lecture at OU

Oakland University's **School of Education and Human Services** is hosting an afternoon tea featuring noted children's book author **Natalie Kinsey-Warnock** on Tuesday, July 20, at 2 p.m. at the Educational Resources Laboratory in 350 Pawley Hall. The lecture is part of the Author's and Illustrator's Art and Craft course at Oakland University.

Kinsey-Warnock has authored such books as "The Canada Geese Quilt," "The Wild Horses of Sweetbriar" and "The Night the Bells Rang." She has authored 14 picture books and novels for young readers and is currently working on more than 30 books.

Kinsey-Warnock, who lives in Vermont with her husband, six dogs, six cats and three horses, travels the country to visit schools and encourage students to look for stories within their own families. She believes every family has stories that need to be written down, told and passed on to the next generation.
