OU FACULTY ATTEND ASIAN STUDIES CONFERENCE

Three OU faculty members were active as panel members or were elected to office during the 26th annual meeting of the Association for Asian Studies held recently in Boston, Mass.

They are Susan G. Hadden, political science, Peter Bertocci, anthropology-sociology, and Carlo Coppola, modern languages and linguistics.

Susan G. Hadden organized and presided over a panel entitled "The Politics of Agricultural Change in South Asia: A Round Table Discussion."

She also attended the meeting of the trustees of the American Institute of Indian Studies as Oakland University's representative. OU has been a member of the American Institute of Indian Studies since 1970.

Peter Bertocci organized and presided over a panel entitled "Up the Down Staircase: Intermediate Social Structures in Bangladesh." On this panel Bertocci also presented a paper entitled "Researching the Bangladesh Rural Community: The Problems of Levels of Social Organization."

Carlo Coppola was elected in absentia to the steering committee of the newly-formed North Indian Studies Association, which held its organizational meeting in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Association for Asian Studies. He also participated in absentia in the Conference on South Asian Library and Documentation held in Boston April 4-6. His paper "Problems of Access for Small South Asia Programs with Limited Resources: A Faculty View" was read out by a colleague on the panel dealing with the problem of access to South Asian library materials.

SENATE APPROVES NURSING AND AREA STUDIES PROGRAMS

The Oakland University Senate, in its April 23 final meeting of the year, approved an organized faculty and School of Nursing and recommended to the president and Board of Trustees that a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (B.S.N.) be authorized. In

other actions, the Senate approved a new master of arts program in Area Studies.

The nursing proposals need approval of the trustees, the State Board of Education and the State Board of Nursing. The area studies program must be authorized by the OU board and the State Board of Education.

In a final action, a proposal to join the Association of Michigan Collegiate Faculties was approved.
