Winter 2009 Class Registration

Winter 2009 class **registration** is quickly approaching. It is important to keep up-to-date with university requirements and reminders that will help you in the registration process. Read below for information you need to know when registering for next semester.

Scheduling Smarts

• Examine the **schedule of classes**. Click **here** for a printable version of the schedule.

• The recommended **course load** is 16 credit hours. Although you only need to take 12 credit hours to be considered a full-time student, taking 12 credit hours each semester will, in most majors, not allow you to graduate in 4 to 5 years.

• Become familiar with the university's **general education requirements** along with your major requirements as indicated in the **university catalog**.

• Be sure to schedule an appointment with your **academic adviser** if you have any questions about course selection.

• If you need a refresher on how to register on **SAIL**, check out instructions **here**.

• To determine if there is a **hold** on your account preventing registration, log-in to **SAIL**, click on SAIL on the black bar at the top of the screen, then click Student Services & Financial Aid, click on Student Records, and then click View Holds. If you find a hold on your account, immediately contact the department indicated to determine what steps you need to take to get back on track.

• Check out the degree evaluation feature on **SAIL** to track your progress toward obtaining a degree. To use this feature, log-in to **SAIL**, click on SAIL on the black bar at the top of the screen, click Student Services & Financial Aid, then Student Records, then click Degree Evaluation.
