OU to offer quantum learning strategies

Oakland University's School of Education and Human Services (SEHS) will offer Quantum Learning for Teachers, a program providing key strategies to increase student achievement by optimizing instructional skills and creating a positive and engaging learning environment. The summer institute is offered in partnership with Chippewa Valley Schools. It is scheduled from June 14 to 18 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at Dakota High School in Macomb.

Quantum Learning is designed for K-12 teachers, school administrators, and home-based educators. Its research-based approach offers a variety of strategies for increasing achievement and satisfaction in the classroom for both students and teachers. Participants will learn how to create an engaging, brain-compatible learning environment, improve presentation skills, design dynamic lessons and use effective methods to help students take greater responsibility for their own learning.
