Summer patio concerts presented at OC

A series of five patio concerts will be held at the Oakland Center this summer, hosted by the Student Program Board and Center for Student Activities.

The outdoor concerts are scheduled from 11:45 a.m. to 1 p.m. on the following Wednesdays: May 29, June 12, June 26, July 10 and July 24. In case of inclement weather, the concerts will be moved to a location within the Oakland Center.

OU Food Service will have a grilled lunch available for all concertgoers at an affordable charge.

Patio Concert Schedule:

- **May 29** – Brindisi String Quarter, which formed in 1984 and whose name comes from fine wine. The players are professional string players from the metro Detroit area.
- **June 12** – Steel Drum and African Drum Ensembles directed by Mark Stone. The ensembles are student groups from OU's **Department of Music, Theatre and Dance**.
- **June 26** – Upscale, a dynamic multitalented vocal trio from Detroit which provides an exciting, energetic and sensational floor show, including flowing choreography and soaring vocals reminiscent of groups such as the Temptations, Four Tops and other Motown favorites.
- **July 10** – "Star" Noel is a 15-year-old singer with a voice that will remind you of Charlotte Church. This young diva sings anything from opera arias to popular songs.
- **July 24** – Kerstin Allvin is one of the most prominent harp performers in southeast Michigan and Nadine Deleury is one of the finest cello performers. Both have played around the world independently and as a duo. Now, for the first time they will perform together on the Oakland Center patio for your enjoyment.
