OU's School of Nursing to offer new master's programs

Oakland University's School of Nursing is accepting registration for two new master's degree programs. A Master of Science in adult/gerontological nurse practitioner and a Master of Science in nursing education will begin this fall.

The Master of Science in adult/gerontological nurse practitioner program will prepare the advanced practice nurse as a primary care provider for adult, older adult and frail elder clients in a variety of settings. The curriculum focuses on culturally sensitive care, incorporating health promotion and management of acute and chronic health problems.

The Master of Science in nursing education program will prepare nurses to teach in an academic setting. The curriculum focuses on program and course design, development and evaluation. Students study learning styles, teaching methods and evaluation strategies. A field experience, which will occur in an academic setting, provides students with the opportunity to apply these skills in actual classroom and clinical environments under the guidance of expert School of Nursing faculty. Graduates of the nursing education program are prepared to teach in both classroom and clinical settings.
